CENTRE FOR MARITIME LAW

The National Law University Odisha, Cuttack (NLUO) established the Centre for Maritime Law in 2015 with an aim to build a center of excellence and research in the field of maritime law in India.

The Centre identifies first and foremost, that the statutes which govern maritime law were adapted from foreign states and these statutes don't address the concerns pertaining to the field appropriately, as the Indian trade practices are relatively different from those foreign states. Also, under the Indian maritime law regime, there has been a lack of timely amendments and proper implementation and hence most of the laws are outdated and are not equipped to deal with modern complications. The Centre is currently working on Indian statutes, case laws, international

treaties and conventions pertaining to maritime law and seeks to crystallize the current maritime jurisprudence in India.

The Centre in collaboration with H. P Law Advocates and Pardip Port Trust successfully organised the 1st International Conference on Maritime Law in February 2020 with the theme "Reshaping the New Horizons: Maritime Law perspective in the twenty-first century". The Centre also edited and published the edited book, titled 'THROUGH THE LENS OF MARITIME LAW: A WORLD VIEW'. The book contains editorial chapters by scholars from all across the globe. Furthermore, the Centre successfully conducted an interactive webinar on 'Dimensions and Opportunities in Maritime Law in July 2020 which received huge participation from all over the country.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- The essay must be in English language only and the submission has to be made in Microsoft Word (.doc or.docx format).
- Co-authorship to a <u>maximum of two</u> is permitted.
- Only one submission is allowed per author. Submissions, both as co-author and single, will be treated as multiple submissions and will be disqualified as an entry to the competition.
- There should not be any form of identification mark such as name of the author, University/College name etc. on the essay. Any form of identification will lead to disqualification.
- The essay should be of 1500 2000 words, excluding footnotes.
- The essay must contain an abstract of not more than 200 words including keywords.
- The write-ups shall have no plagiarism and should be an original work of the participants.
- The participants shall follow Bluebook 20th Edition as the mode of Citation.

FORMATTING CRITERIA:

- Main Body: Font Times New Roman, Font Size 12, and Line Spacing - 1.5.
- Footnotes: Font Times New Roman, Font Size 10, and Line Spacing – 1.0

Margins should be 1 inch or 2.54 cm on all sides.

- There is no registration fee for this competition.

- Please maintain due diligence while filling the Google form. Credentials of participants will be checked for successful registration.
- The deadline for submission is 23/05/2021.


