1. Gopakumaran Nair, (CW1)

F/o deceased

- To prove that, he is the father of the deceased and registered a complaint before the police station regarding the missing of his daughter on 6th Sep 2020 at 8pm. Subsequently he identified the body as his daughter.
- 2. Mohamed, ASI of Museum PS (CW2)
- Station House Officer (SHO) at the time and registered FIR regarding the missing of the CW1's daughter.
- 3. Robert of Poojappura (CW3)

To prove that, CW3 found the dead body of an unidentified girl near his residence at Poojapura drench. To prove that while he was walking around his house, he heard a sound of a car and he saw something being dumped into the dark corner of the road from the car.

- 4. Rajan, Poojappura(CW4)
- To prove that, he was present at the time of inquest report.





5. Govind, Poojappura(CW5)

To prove that, he was present at the time of preparation of the inquest of the deceased at 10:30pm and signed in the inquest report.

6. Dr. Jose, Doctor (CW6)

To prove that, he had sent a message and made a phone call to the Police station regarding the missing of the patient admitted by him at the SKY Hospital with the head injury under suspicious circumstances.

- 7. Dinesan, RPF Inspector at Ernakulum South Railway Station (CW7)
- To prove that, RPF officer working at EKM South Police station detained the person in the CCTV footage and informed the same to the Station House Officer, Museum.
- 8. Renjith (CW8), ASI from Museum Police Station.
- To prove that, as per the statement of CW7 (RPF officer) and as per the order issued by the SHO, CW8 went to the Ernakulam South Railway station where the accused was handed over to him.





9. Ramani, Thycaud (CW9)

To prove that, on 6 September 2020, she heard the screaming of a girl from the car near Thycaud Post office.

10. Ramesan Pillai (CW10)

To prove that, he identified the accused and the accused bought a sharp knife from his shop.

11. Dr. Abdul Rahman (CW11)

To prove that, he has conducted post mortem of the deceased and submitted the same to the court.

12. Dasan (CW12),

To prove that, he was a witness to the recovery proceedings and that the accused confessed in front of him to the police officer.

13. Ratheesh, Inspector (CW13)

To prove that he conducted the investigation, recorded the arrest of the accused, interrogated the witnesses, recovered the car along with iron rod and knife, the accused admitted that with the said knife he had committed the murder, charge sheeted the case and send the same before the judicial first-class magistrate court, Vanchiyoor, Trivandrum.





DEFENCE

- to prove that the accused called and informed him that he got injured and was going to Ernakulum.
- 2. Santhi(DW2), sister of accused,
- To prove that, the accused called her and informed of his injury and that he was going to Ernakulam.
- 3. Ravi Kumar, (DW3), owner of shop near Karamana Jn.
- his shop at Karamana Jn, he saw the accused being surrounded by a bunch of people and witnessed one of them hitting the accused.





Accused Joshi is a car broker, residing at Panchami, Thevally, Kollam. Accused was coming in his car KL-01-BQ-805 from Peroorkada to Thampanoor at around 4 pm on 6.9.2020. As he approached Kaveri Shopping Complex at Kowdiar, he saw a girl (Renu) around 20 years waiting near the road side. He stopped and told her that he is going to the city and asked whether she wanted any lift. She was hesitant initially, but accepted his offer since she had to reach SK Women's College for a function at 5 pm and no cabs were available.

As the car reached SK College junction, accused didn't stop. The girl panicked and started shouting for help. Accused was fascinated by her beauty and wanted to have fun with her. She pulled his hair and hit him with an iron rod which was available in the car. He got furious and in the fit of rage, he stabbed her with his knife on her head. She instantaneously died as brain parts came out due to the stabbing. This had happened near Thycaud Post Office at about 5.45 pm, where Ramani noticed a girl screaming from the car. As the accused noticed her watching, he sped away from the scene.

He waited for darkness to fall while driving through the Poojappura-Pangodu road. As soon as it became dark, he went to Poojappura and took the car to the Poojapura drench where he dumped the body behind a bush and returned in the same car. Robert saw a person dumping something which was presumed to be some sort of waste, after a while he went to look into the same and found the body of the deceased.

The injury on the forehead of the accused was deep and hence he went to SKY Hospital, for treatment. He reached there at 8:30pm and Dr. Jose, attended the wound. He admitted the accused in the hospital for a 24-hour observation. On enquiry, accused told that the injury was a result of a fight with some unidentified people.

At 8:00 pm, Gopakumaran Nair, the father of the deceased came to the police station to report the incident of his missing daughter. He informed that his daughter who had gone to SK Women's College was now missing.





Meanwhile, as against the advice of the Doctor, the accused left the hospital at his own risk and the doctor reported this incident to the police station around 12:30 am.

Around 12:30 am, the CCTV Footage was sent to the police station by the hospital authorities. This was forwarded to all police stations in order to locate the person in the CCTV footage, and if found, detain and inform the Museum Police. At 9:00pm, Museum Police received a call from Robert from Poojappura, that a body of a girl is seen below the Poojappura drench. ASI Mohamed along with the party rushed to the spot.

A body of a girl around 20 years old was lying behind a bush below the Poojappura drench. Gopakumaran Nair was called to the site. He identified the body as that of his missing daughter and he fell unconscious.

An inquest was conducted by ASI Mohamed. Rajan and Govind were witnesses for the Inquest report. After inquest, the body was transported to Medical College Mortuary at 11:30 pm.

A FIR 121/2020 which was recorded in the Museum Police Station for manmissing was converted into Sec.302 of IPC.

Post mortem was conducted the next day by Dr. Abdul Rahman. Post Mortem report clearly says that the death was caused as a result of a deep wound on the head by a sharp weapon like a knife. The wound was, "one incised over the left mastoid area placed obliquely of size $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $\frac{1}{2}$ ", bone deep, was completely cut and the size of cut on the bone $1\frac{1}{2}$ " deep through which brain material was coming out. There was no sign of rape or any other injuries. As per the Doctor, death might have occurred 15-18 hours prior to completion of post mortem at 11 am \pm 2 hours variation possible on the calculation of time of death.

The accused after leaving the hospital at 12:00am. On 7.9.2020, the accused went to Kollam in his car and left the car near Kollam railway station and left for Ernakulam in train. He reached Ernakulam South Railway Station at 5.30 am.





RPF Inspector Dinesan noticed the accused and identified him from the CCTV footage sent by museum police. He detained the accused and informed the Museum police, who then brought him to Trivandrum. On detailed questioning, accused finally confessed the crime. He was arrested at 4 pm on 7.9.2020. He was produced before the Judicial Magistrate of 1st class, Thiruvananthapuram at 11 am on 8.9.2020.

Magistrate allowed police remand for 5 days.

The accused gave a statement under Sec. 27 of Evidence Act in which it was stated that a red Honda Amaze car with the registration number, KL-01-BQ-805 is parked near the Kollam Railway station. The knife used for murder and the iron rod used by deceased to hit him were also recovered from the car.

He was then taken near Kollam railway station from where the car, knife and iron rod were recovered under S.27 of the Evidence Act. Accused was taken to hardware shop from where he purchased the knife. The owner of the shop Ramesan Pillai identified the knife as sold by him to accused.

From the aforesaid evidences, material objects and witness statements, it is proved that accused has committed the murder and is liable to be prosecuted under Sec. 302 IPC.





DEPOSITIONS

1. Gopakumaran Nair (CW1):

S/o Raman Nair, father of the deceased.

I am a government servant working as a teacher at Pattom LP School Trivandrum. I am residing with my wife, daughter Renu and my son Suboth. My daughter is studying BA literature at SK Women's college Trivandrum. She was a good anchor. She told me that she is anchoring a program at 5 pm. I gave her permission to attend the program. She left the house at 4pm.I tried to contact her through her mobile number repeatedly around 7 pm but couldn't contact her. I myself made to the college and realized that the program was already finished. Thereafter, I contacted her friends Tulasi and Remya, and her teachers, and came to know that she hasn't attended the program. In her absence, it was anchored by another student. Immediately thereafter I came back home and attempted to contact her through all the reliable sources. None of her friends and relatives had any clues regarding her. I approached the police station and as directed by the police, I submitted the information regarding the missing of my daughter and the police has registered the FIR 121/2020 of Museum Police Station. Subsequently, I returned home at around 8 30pm. At around 10:00 pm, I received a phone call from the Police Station directing me to reach the police station immediately. Police Officer took me to an isolated drench near Poojapura and I found the dead body of my daughter. On seeing the same, I fell unconscious.

2. Mohamed (ASI) (CW2):

S/O Abdul Rahiman, 50-years-old, ASI of Museum Police station.

I am the Assistant Sub inspector of the Museum Police station and the in-charge officer of the Police Station. On 6 September 2020 at 8 PM, Gopakumaran Nair CW1, came to the police station with his wife and son and informed that his daughter was found missing since evening. I enquired about her relatives, friends and also whether she has any affairs. He told me that, he contacted all known sources but didn't found any positive reply. I also attempted to contact her





through her phone no: 9847036543 but her mobile no was switched off. I reasonably came to understand that his complaint is genuine and therefore registered FIR No 121/2020 regarding man missing. I pacified him and advised him to go back to his home.

At about 9:00pm, I received a phone call from one Robert that, a dead body of an unidentified girl aged about 20 years is found near Poojapura drench. I crosschecked the message and being fully satisfied that the message is genuine, rushed to the spot with some Police officers.

The informant Robert was present along with so many other persons and the photo of the missing girl provided by CW1 was with me. I sent the information to Gopakumaran Nair to immediately report to the police station. My assistant Police officer brought him from the station and he identified the dead body and fell unconscious thereafter. I conducted the inquest of the body in the presence of the witnesses. The body was then sent to the medical college Trivandrum for Postmortem at about 11:30 pm. On 7th September. Around 12:30 am, I received a phone call from Dr Jose that, an unidentified man aged about 35 years of age got admitted at the SKY Hospital with severe head injury. He was found missing under suspicious circumstances. I contacted him and directed him to produce the details of the patient along with the CCTV footage if available, and the same is forwarded to me immediately.

3. Robert (CW3):

S/o Christ Abraham, president of VRS Residence Association.

I am working as a Bank Manager at SBT, Kowdiar Trivandrum. My family and I are permanently residing at Poojapura. I am the President of the Residence association. I often go walks at night time. On 6th of September, around 8 pm, I noticed that a car stopped near my house where there was no street light. I saw something being dumped there from the car and then the car quickly proceeded to the northern direction. After a while, I was suspicious that some waste was disposed into our residential area and went to the spot after my walk with a torch light. That is when I found the dead body of a girl about 20 years of age.





Immediately I contacted the residence association secretary and other residences. Thereafter, I informed the police and the police authorities reached the spot at that time and prepared the inquest in our presence. Meanwhile, the father of the deceased was brought by the police and he identified the body and fell unconscious. The body of the girl was then taken for post mortem and other legal formalities

4. Rajan (CW4):

S/o Rajashekar SR, NRI returned, Secretary of VRS Residence Association

I am the secretary of VRS residence Association for the last 3 years, and prior to that, I was a software engineer in USA. At about 8:30pm, the president of the residence Association, Robert, called me and informed me that he found a dead body of a young girl in that Poojapura drench. Immediately I contacted our residence Association members and all of us rushed to the spot. We found the dead body of a young girl around 20 yrs. immediately. As instructed by us, Robert contacted the police Station and the police came to the spot. Later the father of the deceased identified the dead body and he fell unconscious. The inquest was conducted in my presence. Thereafter, the body was taken to the Trivandrum medical college for medical legal formalities.

5. Govind (CW5):

s/o Rajendran Nair, resident of VRS Residence Association

I have been a resident at VRS Residence Association for the past few years. On the 6th of September,2020 at around 8:30pm, Rajan, the secretary of VRS Residence Association contacted me and some of the other residents and informed us that Robert had found a dead body of a young girl in the Poojapura drench. I quickly rushed to the spot along with some of the other residents in our area. There I saw the dead body of a girl of around 20 years of age. The police arrived soon after Robert contacted them. The father of the deceased girl was then brought to the spot and on seeing his daughter he fell unconscious. The inquest was conducted in my presence.





6. **Dr. Jose (CW6):**

s/o Zakria Thomas, Assistant surgeon.

I am working as an assistant Surgeon at SKY Hospital on 6th September 2020. I was having night duty from 6 pm to 6 am in the causality. At about 8:30pm, a moderately complex man at around 35years turned to my hospital with a head injury on his forehead. Some scratches were also visible in his body and he informed that some unidentified persons attempted to cause grievous injury to him at Poojapura at around 7 pm. After examining the patient, I found that his injury is reasonably serious and accordingly he is admitted as inpatient. At about 12:30 am the duty nurse informed me that the patient was found missing.

The hospital authorities attempted to contact him through his mobile number but there was no response. Hence, I intimated the matter to the SHO, Museum Police Station. The patient looked very frantic and annoyed at the time of examination. Now I realized that he conducted the murder of Renu.

7. Dinesan, (CW7):

S/o Diwakar S, Railway Police Force Inspector South Police station EKM.

On 7Th September 2020, I was working as RPF Inspector at Ernakulum South Police Station. Maveli Express reached the South Station at about 5:30 am. I noticed, a man aged around 35 years of age with severe injury on his forehead attempting to frantically run through the entrance gate. Being suspicious of this strange behavior, I intercepted him and asked him to produce the ticket. He showed me a ticket from Kollam to Mangalore. He did not have sufficient explanation as to why he got down at Ernakulum South Station. Meanwhile, I also noticed a message from the museum Police Station, Trivandrum regarding a suspicious inpatient who escaped from Sky hospital. I noticed that the CCTV footage of the suspicious person who escaped from the hospital and the person interrogated by me is one and the same as both of them are having the same injury on their forehead. Thereafter, I contacted the museum police and detained him in custody. On the same day at about 3 pm, the police





officers from Museum Police Station came to the RPF office and after the formalities, handed over the person to the concerned police authorities.

8. Renjith (CW8):

s/o Reghu, ASI from Museum Police Station

On receiving a call from the RPF Inspector of the Ernakulam South Police Station, I along with other officers from the Museum Police Station went to Ernakulam South Police station. We reached there around 3pm and the detained accused was handed over to us

9. Ramani (CW9):

D/o Radhamma, aged 37 years, VRA345, Vanchiyoor, Trivandrum.

I am working as a sales girl at Star Bakery, Poojapura, Trivandrum for the last 3 years. I am getting a monthly salary of Rs 10000. My working time is from 8am to 4 pm. As usual, while returning home on that day, I noticed the loud screaming of a girl inside a red car. I then attempted to chase the car but they swiftly proceeded towards the northern direction. I tried to inform this matter to the pedestrians, unfortunately no one paid attention to my words. After 2 to 3 days, I noticed that a person was arrested in connection with the murder of a young girl and the car which the police ceased was identical to the one that I saw. I informed the same to the owner of the bakery and he communicated the same to the police. Police officials interrogated me and showed me the car. I can identify the car and the person who drove the car. I can also identify the girl who was screaming inside the car.

10. Ramesan Pillai (CW10):

s/o Ramesh K Nair, owner of Kumar Industries.

I am the proprietor and the owner of Kumar Industries, Chalai, Trivandrum. On 4th September, 2020, at 4 pm, a young man aged 35 years came to my shop and expressed the desire to purchase the sharp-edged knife, I showed the different varieties of knife and he purchased a knife worth Rs.200 which was shown to me





by the police. Now I realize that the knife was purchased by the accused to commit murder of the deceased.

11. Dr. Abdul Rahman (CW11):

s/o Rahman Ahmed, Doctor

Conducted post mortem on the deceased body, brought by Museum police and submitted the post mortem report.

12. Dasan (CW12):

s/o Das, owner of the provisional shop near Kollam Railway station.

I noticed that a car was parked unusually near to my provisional store for nearly 2 days. On the 8th of September 2020, at about 3 pm, the accused opened the car in my presence and he took a blood-stained knife from the dashboard and the iron rod from the back seat of the car and the same was handed over to the police and the police thereafter prepared the mahasar and it was signed by me. The accused confessed that it was the knife he used to commit the murder of the victim.

13. Ratheesh, Inspector (CW13):

s/o Gopalan Nair

On 7th Sep 2020, I took charge of the investigation regarding the murder of a young girl named Renu aged 20 years, at Poojapura drench. As per the information provided by the CW7(RPF officer), I deputed CW8 ASI and two other police officers to arrest and handover the suspicious person. At 7th September at 10 pm, on interrogation, the accused confessed before me that, he committed the murder with the sharp-edged knife. The blood-stained knife and the iron rod were kept in the car of the accused. Accordingly, I took the accused to the Kollam Railway station, where his car bearing no: KL-01-BQ-805, Honda Amaze, was parked and the blood-stained knife and the iron rod were recovered in the presence of the witness. The accused further told me that the knife was purchased from the shop of Ramesan Pillai (CW10), who identified the accused and the knife. I have collected the statement of all the witnesses in connection





with the entire incident and was convinced that accused has committed the offence. The intention of the accused was to rape her and to steal her ornaments. As the deceased strongly protested during the kidnapping, the accused failed to do the same. In order to silence her during the scuffle, the accused was forced to stab the victim, though his intention was only to intimidate the deceased with knife and to commit the crime. I have completed the investigation and submitted the final report under 173(2) Cr.PC to the court.

Defense Witness:

1. Premachandran(DW1)

S/O Suresh S, friend and business partner of the accused.

I am the close friend and the business partner of the accused. Myself, accused, Shiva and Chandra are car brokers at Trivandrum, Cochin, Calicut and Kollam respectively. We run a business of selling used cars at Trivandrum, Cochin, Calicut and Kollam for the last 5 years. We are business partners and share our profits together. Last month, he sold a BMW car for Rs 25 lakhs to Mr. Sunil at Trivandrum but the vehicle was having some mechanical problem which we failed to notice. Mr. Sunil was not satisfied with the performance and repeatedly threatened the accused. The accused was ordered to trade back the vehicle and they threatened him to teach a lesson. On 6th September 2020, when the accused parked the car in Karamana Junction, a few unidentified persons came near him and asked his name. When he answered, suddenly, one person hit him. They shouted that this is a warning for all cheating car brokers. Thereafter they rushed from the spot. The accused was taken to the nearest hospital by some unidentified person. Accused gave information regarding the same before the doctor. Immediately thereafter, the accused contacted me over the phone. I asked him to take preliminary treatment from the hospital and to reach Ernakulam specialty hospital at the earliest where I have some good connection with the doctors. Contrary to the request of the accused, he was admitted as an inpatient and the doctor decided to conduct a surgery on the very next day. He refused the same





and decided to discharge himself from the hospital. The hospital authorities refused to accept his request. So as per my advice he voluntarily left from the hospital and proceeded to Ernakulam. I was waiting outside Ernakulam railway station to receive the accused and to get him admitted to the specialty hospital. Unfortunately for reasons unknown, the RPF officials intercepted the accused at Ernakulam South Station and despite our request, they refused to give him proper treatment.

2. Santhi, (DW2) sister of the accused S/o Sankar

I am the sister of the accused and on the 6th of September, 2020, I received a call from my brother. He informed me that he had suffered an injury and that he was going to Ernakulam Specialty Hospital to get treatment.

3. Ravi Kumar (DW3), owner of shop near Karamana jn. S/o Radha

I am running a small shop at Karamana jn. On 6th September 2020, around 4pm, I was preparing tea and snack. I saw that a person around 35 years was surrounded by 3 or more persons. After some interrogation, one of the persons attempted to hit him and he sustained injury in the head and fell down, the assailants suddenly ran away from the spot. I rushed to the spot with some other people who were nearby. Some people took him to the nearest SKY hospital. I can identify the injured and the assailants.






